THANET AND DISTRICT REFORM SYNAGOGUE REPORT OF THE SYNAGOGUE COUNCIL

For the year ended 31 December 2017

The Synagogue Council presents its report together with the Accounts for the year ended 31 December 2017.

LEGAL STATUS

The Congregation of the Thanet & District Reform Synagogue is a charity registered with the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales and is governed by its Constitution adopted on 26 March 2000 last amended 29 March 2015.

OBJECTS

The objects of the Synagogue are to provide and maintain a Synagogue for the purposes of public worship and of advancing religious, educational and charitable activities. The Public Benefit has been detailed in the Review of Progress on page 4.

THE SYNAGOGUE COUNCIL

The Synagogue Council comprises the members of the Synagogue who have the general control and management of the administration of the Synagogue and are the Trustees of the Synagogue. Members of the Synagogue Council are appointed under the Constitution of the Synagogue.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SYNAGOGUE COUNCIL

The Constitution requires the Synagogue Council to prepare Accounts for each financial year which gives a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Synagogue and the surplus or deficit of the Synagogue for the period covered by the Accounts. In preparing such accounts the Synagogue Council are required to:

Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently.

Make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.

State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures, which must be disclosed and explained in the accounts.

Prepare the accounts on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to do so. The Synagogue Council are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the Synagogue. The Synagogue Council are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Synagogue and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

RESERVES POLICY

It is anticipated that future income will continue at a level to support expenditure and any reserves will be controlled by the Trustees. As at 31 December 2017 funds stood at £135,765 (2016 £132,401).

REVIEW OF PROGRESS

During 2017 the Synagogue held services for public worship on a regular basis, including additional special services for the High Holy days and other festivals. Fundraising and social events were held throughout the year to help towards Synagogue finances and also for the wider community. In the year we continued to use the newly introduced community care programme called "Chesed". Our other links with our members and friends of the community continue as before, these being regular Emailshots, magazine "Etz Chaim", "What's On" newsletter and the community's website, www.tdrs.org.uk.

Services and religious based activities such as Shabbat Suppers, Torah Breakfasts, Simchat Torah, Purim and Chanukah celebrations, etc. were all well supported. The Havdallah Club (children's religious classes) provides a high standard of Jewish knowledge as was seen by the excellent display material they produce for the major festivals.

In the wider community we continued to support the Mayor of Ramsgate's annual National Holocaust Day service as well as Rabbi Cohen's on-going work with local schools, including the very popular visits to the Synagogue premises. We welcomed visitors to join us for services and events. We continued to support external charities with collection of foods for donation to local homeless charity Porchlight. Through our annual Kol Nidre Appeal we support a national Jewish charity and a local Kent based charity. We are a constituent member of the Movement for Reform Judaism and are represented at the Board of Deputies of British Jews.

In the course of the year we welcomed civic dignitaries including local MP and mayors to a dedication service for our new memorial tree dedicated to the memory of the lost Jewish community of Klatovy. Each of the leaves bears the names of community members lost in the holocaust, with the names having been hand written by synagogue members a few years ago. We also launched an appeal for funds to cover the cost of repairs to the Sefer Torah scroll from Klatovy on permanent loan to us from the Westminster Scroll Trust.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting Conventions

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and In accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice: "Accounting by Charities").

Subscriptions

Subscriptions are accounted for net of the burial scheme levy and after making allowances for any subscriptions reduced through financial hardship.

Donations

Donations are accounted for in the year in which they are pledged or received.

Functions

Functions are accounted for on a net profit basis that represents gross receipts less expense directly attributable to the event.

Income Tax Repayments

Credit has been taken in respect of available income tax payments on Gift Aid for subscriptions and donations received in the year.

Interest Received

Interest received is accounted for on the basis of amounts actually or due to be credited to interest bearing accounts in the year.

Depreciation

Assets are depreciated on a straight line basis, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual values over the life of the asset. The Freehold Property including the extension and silverware have not been depreciated as the Honorary Officers are of the opinion that there has been no diminution in value below cost.
