ANNUAL REPORT

The past year has been generally one of quiet and steady progress and the following paragraphs record events which make up the life of the community.

The highlight of the year was perhaps the Civic Service for the Mayor of Hammersmith, Councillor Stanley Atkins, J.P., held in our Synagogue on Sunday, 9th June. The Service was conducted by Rev. I. L. Abrams, Minister of the Shepherds Bush Synagogue, together with Rev. S. Venitt and Rev. S. Forscher, with the choir under the direction of Mr. B. H. Busky.

A full report appeared in the last number of "Brook."

On Sunday, 5th May, 1963, a Supper evening was held at the Synagogue Hall to open the year's J.P.A. Appeal Campaign for our area, The local J.P.A. Executive under the Chairman, Dr. L. Freeman, the Vice-Chairman, Mr. J. G. Silver, and the Treasurer, Mr. B. Davis, successfully raised the sum of well over £3,000.

At the Annual Dinner and Ball held at the Porchester Hall, Bayswater, on Sunday, 8th December, the Guests of Honour were the Mayor and Mayoress of Hammersmith. The evening was a social and financial success and enjoyed by all who attended. Thanks are due to Mr. A. Coleman, President of the Functions Committee, and to Mr. F. J. Gertler and Mrs. A. Turner, his Chairman and Vice-Chairman, no less to those hard working members of the committee who were responsible for the success of the occasion.

A beautiful stained glass window over the Ark was presented by Mr. C. Libowitz in memory of his wife, and a full report on this was given in the September 1963 "Brook."

At Simchat Torah the Synagogue was happy and delighted to accord the honours of Chasan Torah and Chasan Bereshith to Rev. S. Venitt and Dr. L. Freeman,

The Autumn series of lectures (under the auspices of Jews' College) was given by Rabbi Dr. S. Goldman on "Fundamental Books of Judaism." This interesting and well-delivered course was illustrated with magnificent colour slides, including a bonus in the form of a visit to Israel at the end of the lecture.

This last occasion was taken as an opportunity to make a presentation to Dr. and Mrs. L. Freeman in acknowledgement of their Silver Wedding Anniversary.

The thanks of the congregation due to the Ladies Guild (and those husbands who are presumably honorary members), for so beautifully decorating the Succah. We are no less grateful to the members of the Synagogue whose gifts in cash and kind enabled us to enjoy our Succot at the Synagogue.

During the year the Rev. S. Venitt has had a steady attendance for his Thursday evening lectures on the Siddur.

We are pleased to record that a small membership committee under the active Chairmanship of Mr. M. Presky, has worked hard at the unostentatious but really important task of improving our membership. In this connection, it is worthy of note that 10 marriages were celebrated at the Synagogue during the year. A higher figure then for some time.

On the financial side the income for the year was £8,660, and it is pleasant to record an improvement in the income received from covenants. The surcharge imposed on all male members of the United Synagogue by the Council of the United Synagogue at Passover 1963 brought in the sum estimated. The past year saw the retirement of Charles Baumgartner, our Caretaker. He and his wife have left London to live in the West Country. We were pleased to have them with us and they take the best wishes of the congregation for the future.

We have been fortunate in obtaining a new Caretaker, Mr. L. Rogers, and he and his wife have taken up residence. We hope they will enjoy their stay with us.

The Hon. Officers and Board of Management place on record their sincere appreciation of the work of our officials, Rev. S. Venitt, Minister, Rev. S. Forscher, Reader, Mr. Gerald Cohen, Secretary, and Mr. B. H. Busky, Choir Master. The congregation is indeed fortunate to be served by such a sincere and devoted staff. In addition the Hon. Officers wish to record their pleasure in working with their colleagues on the Board of Management.

WESTERN AREA REGIONAL CLASSES

The national statistical trend has been reflected in the enrolment number of the Hebrew Classes, which now stands at 110 pupils. Mr. Maurice DeVries, who is one of our most zealous participants in Synagogue procedure and ritual, has joined our teaching staff and is undertaking the tuition of the elementary class. All children are invited to make use of the splendid juvenile library in the Waley-Cohen Room. Books dealing with many aspects of the Jewish Way of Life and with vivid accounts of famous personages in Jewish history and literature, may be borrowed on application to Rev. Venitt.

The Annual Chanucah Service held jointly with Shepherds Bush, Fulham and District Synagogue, took place at the latter venue on Sunday, 15th December, 1963, in the presence of the Mayor of Hammersmith, Councillor S. Atkins, J.P. Thanks to the intensive preparatory vocal tuition by the Rev. S. Forscher, the youthful officiants acquitted themselves admirably. Barend Velleman acted as Reader of the Mincha Service and Jeremy and David Evnine and Mervyn Beth sang the tranditional Chanucah melodies most pleasingly. Appropriate selections from the historical records of the Maccabean heroes were competently rendered by Esther Kraus, Caroline Gassman, Vivien Ohayon, Elizabeth Benzimra and Ruth Forscher.

We have sustained a great loss in the death of Mr. Aaron Shenfield, one of the most devoted representatives on the Western Area Education Committee. His sage counsel in pedagogic presentation, in the realm of Hebrew knowledge and scholarship, and in education as a whole, proved of inestimable value. He will be sadly missed.

A most effective "Mock Seder" took place on Sunday morning, March 22nd, 1964, under the supervision of the joint Superintendents. Authentic atmosphere was provided by the Passover culinary and ritual embellishments on a long table surrounded by a "Ma Nishtana" crowd of eager juvenile participants. Many children were accompanied by their parents who enjoyed the nostalgic scene with utter absorption in the traditional setting and with the melodies of Seder Night.

The Annual Prize Distribution will take place on Sunday, May 24th, 1964. Our guest of honour will be Rabbi Dr. J. J. Ross, who has recently been appointed as Deputy Principal of Jews' College. With his unique scholastic background in the multifacetted setting of Rhodesia, Israel and England, he has demonstrated his mastery of Jewish sources and profound insight into the spiritual needs of Jewish youth.

HAMMERSMITH SYNAGOGUE LADIES' GUILD

The Guild once again was responsible for decorating the Synagogue for Shavuoth.

Parcels have been sent three times this year to the Jewish patients at the Southall Mental Hospital.

A roll of velvet was given to the Guild and Mrs. Wynbergen made two new Sefer Torah covers for the Synagogue.

Seventeen members of the Guild made a very pleasant tour of Cadby Hall in October.

The Guild helped to organise the Simchat Torah Party, and in November provided tea for nearly 100 Standard Bearers from AJEX, in the Communal Hall.

On the 12th January a very successful Social and Card Evening was held, and on the 15th January some members of the Friendship Club and Guild Committees entertained to tea a party of handicapped children from the Ravenswood Home who had visited the Circus.

On 3rd March a Social Evening was held during which presentations of Trees in Israel were made to Mrs. J. Caplan and Mrs. F. Hodes, Past Chairmen of the Guild, and also a presentation was made to the Rev. and Mrs. S. Venitt, on the occasion of their Silver Wedding.

To celebrate their Silver Wedding, our President, Rev. Venitt, and Mrs. Venitt, gave a party and a presentation on behalf of the members was made by our Life-President, Mrs. J. Apfel.

LECTURE ACTIVITIES 1963-1964

Over a period of twelve years, the Hammersmith Synagogue has organised no less than 15 full courses of University Extension Lectures under the auspices of Jews' College, on subjects of profound Jewish interest. This congregation has gained a deserved reputation throughout the London Jewish community as one of the pioneers in the field of adult Jewish Education. It is therefore a matter of concern that our most recent course in the autumn of 1963, given most brilliantly and lucidly by Rabbi Dr. S. Goldman on the vital subject of "The Fundamental Books of Judaism," was so poorly attended. It is not easy to induce scholars of renown to undertake the necessary preparation and time to deliver popular addresses, when the response is so deplorable.

During the series last autumn, Rabbi Dr. Goldman enlisted the visual aid of screen and slides to idustrate vividly some of the characteristic folios of these classical books of Judaism. He traced the continuity of Jewish traditional sources right back from the Divine Revelation of the Bible. A most comprehensive survey was given of the biblical commentaries and the historical development of the Halachic and Aggadic Midrashim. The formulation of the Mishnah and the rich but labyrinthiae content of the Talmud received much focal attention. The legal and investigative essence of the Halachah and the imagery and folklore of the Agadah were delineated in a most intelligible and popular manner.

Two lectures were devoted to the works of the mediaeval luminary, Maimondes, whose all-en bracing Codes of Jewish Law have cast their particular hue on Jewish scholarship throughout the last eight centuries. It is incredible that one individual could fill a life span with so much spiritual and intellectual content. The lecturer completed the course with a consideration of the great compilation the "Shulchan Aruch" which has become the accepted guide and norm of Jewish ritual practice.

As the final address fell on the seventh day of "Chanucah," a traditional "Neshef" was introduced to conclude the proceedings on a lighter note. A lantern slide "Contemporary Tour of Israel" was shown to an appreciative audience, with special emphasis on some of the religious, historical and archaeological sites and scenes of the Holy Land associated with the personalities described during the lecture course.

We welcome the future co-operation of all our congregants to support our local efforts for the dissemination of Jewish knowledge and to enhance the status of the Hammersmith Synagogue.

HAMMERSMITH AND DISTRICT BRANCH ASSOCIATION OF JEWISH EX-SERVICEMEN AND WOMEN

The Branch has continued most active during the past year under the able Chairmanship of Lenny Benjamin. Fortunately there has been some lessening of Fascist activity in West London and members have not been called upon as frequently as in the previous year to observe meetings and carry out other anti-defamation duties. The strength of the Branch has been well-maintained at over 200 members and all Jewish Ex-Servicemen and Women in the district who have not already done so are invited to join by contacting the Hon. The Branch has continued to work in support of charity, a substantial donation having been sent to the AJEX Charitable Trust and valuable help given to the Mayor of Hammersmith's Springtime Ball. The Branch paid tribute to one of its members, Councillor S. M. Atkins, the present Mayor of the Borough, who, with the Mayoress, Mrs. Atkins, were guests of honour at its 10th Annual Dinner and Ball held on 22nd February last at the Northumberland Grand, an outstanding social occasion.

Branch members and their wives gave splendid support to the AJEX Hospital Scheme at Xmas, working in the wards and kitchens of six local hospitals, relieving nurses and staff from duties to enable them to have an enjoyable holiday. Members also ran a car transport service for hospitals' staff when public transport was not available. This outstanding piece of social service was greatly appreciated by the hospitals and must greatly redound to the good name of the Jewish Community.

WEST LONDON ZIONIST SOCIETY

After a period of inactivity, due to various reasons beyond control, the Society is now planning a revival of activities in the coming season.

To mark the Golden Wedding Anniversary of Mr. and Mrs. Hyman Gelpsman, members of the Society had their names inscribed in the Golden Book of the Jewish National Fund. The presentation was made at a Chanukah Neshef held at the residence of Rev. and Mrs. Venitt.

THE WESTERN AREA PARENTS' ASSOCIATION

The Parents' Association continues to encourage parents to send their children to the Hebrew Classes, and to deal with entertaining, arranging teas and functions for the benefit of the children. The Annual Summer outing took place in June, when we visited Woburn Abbey and had tea at the Luton Synagogue, and despite the appalling weather, this was a great success.

The Chanucah service was held at the Shepherds Bush Synagogue, and all the children received a gift of sweets and chocolates.

Once again there was another Chanucah Ulpan, which was very successful.

Our sporting activities are flourishing, and our Football Team is thriving, although we still need more support from parents (especially fathers)! Girls do not think you have been overlooked, as we are hoping to start a netball team very soon.

AARON SHENFIELD

Aaron Shenfield, who died on 25th February, was a man so modest and habitually self-critical that he probably never realised how much he was respected and loved. He himself loved both scholarship and people, which made him an ideal schoolmaster. From 1931 until his death he taught a constant succession of pupils at the Solomon Wolfson School, where he was Deputy Headmaster, and inspired them with a love of learning and a wholesome breadth of outlook, as well as a scholarly regard for close reasoning. This faithful career was interrupted only by the war, when he served most bravely and conscientiously as a captain in the Army.

His emotions were always closely engaged by the Jewish tradition and for many years he worked steadfastly for the Hamme smith and West Kensington Synagogue (he was warden from 1947 to 1949, and for many years a member of the Board of Management and the Religion Classes Committee).
